<b>Statement</b>	The Manual for School Vehicle Operations produced by the Ministry of Transportation states that firearms or any object that is dangerous in nature must not be transported with students.
<b>Procedures</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>Skates</b> - Skate blades shall be covered by guards, tied together and carried in a bag. The skates shall be placed on the floor of the bus at the student's feet.</li> <li>2. <b>Skis and Poles</b> - Skis and ski poles may be transported on a school bus only if they are properly bound and stored in an open seat. A bus that is equipped with suitable storage space under the floor of the bus is the preferred location for such objects and should be requested whenever possible.</li> <li>3. <b>Hockey Equipment</b> - Hockey equipment may be transported on a school bus only if they are properly bound and stored in an open seat. A bus that is equipped with suitable storage space under the floor of the bus is the preferred location for such objects and should be requested whenever possible.</li> <li>4. <b>Musical Instruments</b> - Musical instruments may be transported if they can be kept on the student's lap.</li> <li>5. <b>Skateboards/Scooters/Roller Blades</b> - Skateboards, scooters, and roller blades shall not be transported on a school bus unless properly stored in a bag.</li> <li>6. <b>Pets</b> - Pets shall not be transported on a school bus with the exception of service/guide dogs or other prescribed assisting animals in accordance with (039) Transporting Students with Service Dogs.</li> <li>7. <b>Other</b> - The decision to transport other objects to and from schools shall be determined in advance by the principal and the school bus operator with STSBHN's input.</li> </ol>
